Before installing a server, be sure that you understand the following warnings and cautions.

- Plug the power cord into a grounded (earthed) electrical outlet that is easily accessible at all times.
- Unplug all the power cords from the power supplies to disconnect power to the equipment.

Use a conductive foam pad if available but not the board wrapper. Do not slide board over any surface.

Installing or removing jumpers: A jumper is a small plastic encased conductor that slips over two jumper pins. Some jumpers have a small tab on top that can be gripped with fingertips or with a pair of fine needle nosed pliers. If the jumpers do not have such a tab, take care when using needle nosed pliers to remove or install a jumper; grip the narrow sides of the jumper with the pliers, never the wide sides. Gripping the wide sides can dam-age the contacts inside the jumper, causing intermittent problems with the function con-trolled by that jumper. Take care to grip with, but not squeeze, the pliers or other tool used to remove a jumper, or the pins on the board may bend or break.

Chapter 1 Hardware Installation

1-1 Installation Precautions

The motherboard/system contain numerous delicate electronic circuits and components which can become damaged as a result of electrostatic discharge (ESD). Prior to installation, carefully read the service guide and follow these procedures:

- Prior to installation, do not remove or break motherboard S/N (Serial Number) sticker or warranty sticker provided by your dealer. These stickers are required for warranty validation.
- Always remove the AC power by unplugging the power cord from the power outlet before installing or removing the motherboard or other hardware components.
- When connecting hardware components to the internal connectors on the motherboard, make sure they are connected tightly and securely.
- When handling the motherboard, avoid touching any metal leads or connectors.
- It is best to wear an electrostatic discharge (ESD) wrist strap when handling electronic components such as a motherboard, CPU or memory. If you do not have an ESD wrist strap, keep your hands dry and first touch a metal object to eliminate static electricity.
- Prior to installing the motherboard, please have it on top of an antistatic pad or within an electrostatic shielding container.
- Before unplugging the power supply cable from the motherboard, make sure the power supply has been turned off.
- Before turning on the power, make sure the power supply voltage has been set according to the local voltage standard.
- Before using the product, please verify that all cables and power connectors of your hardware components are connected.
- To prevent damage to the motherboard, do not allow screws to come in contact with the motherboard circuit or its components.
- Make sure there are no leftover screws or metal components placed on the motherboard or within the computer casing.
- Do not place the computer system on an uneven surface.
- Do not place the computer system in a high-temperature environment.
- Turning on the computer power during the installation process can lead to damage to system components as well as physical harm to the user.
- If you are uncertain about any installation steps or have a problem related to the use of the product, please consult a certified computer technician.

Chapter 3 System Hardware Installation



Pre-installation Instructions

System components and electronic circuit boards can be damaged by discharges of static electricity. Working on systems that are still connected to a power supply can be extremely dangerous. Follow the simple guidelines below to avoid damage to your system or injury to yourself.

- Always disconnect the system from the power outlet whenever you are working inside the system case.
- If possible, wear a grounded wrist strap when you are working inside the system case. Alternatively, discharge any static electricity by touching the bare metal system of the system case, or the bare metal body of any other grounded appliance.
- Hold electronic circuit boards by the edges only. Do not touch the components on the board unless it is necessary to do so. Do not flex or stress the circuit board.
- Leave all components inside the static-proof packaging until you are ready to use the component for the installation.

3-1 Removing the Top Rear Cover




Before you remove the top rear cover:

· Make sure the system is not turned on or connected to AC power.

Follow these instructions to remove the top rear cover:

- 1. Remove the single screw securing the cover.
- 2. Loosen the two thumbnail screws securing the top rear cover in place.
- 3. Slide the cover towards the rear and remove the cover in the direction indicated.



3-2 Installing the PCIe Card





Read the following guidelines before you begin to install the PCIe Card:

- Voltages can be present within the server whenever an AC power source is connected. This
 voltage is present even when the main power switch is in the off position. Ensure that the system
 is powered down and all power sources have been disconnected from the server prior to installing
 a PCIe card. Make sure the system is not turned on or connected to AC power.
- Failure to observe these warnings could result in personal injury or damage to the equipment.

Follow these instructions to install the PCIe card:

- 1. Remove the two screws securing the PCIe card slot covers in place and remove the PCIe card slot covers.
- 2. Insert the PCIe card into the selected slot. Make sure the PCIe card is properly seated.
- 3. Install the two screws to secure the PCIe card in place.





3-3 Installing the CPU and Heatsink



Read the following guidelines before you begin to install the CPU:

- Make sure that the motherboard supports the CPU.
- Always turn off the system and unplug the power cord from the power outlet before installing the CPU to prevent hardware damage.
- · Unplug all cables from the power outlets.
- · Disconnect all telecommunication cables from their ports.
- · Place the system unit on a flat and stable surface.
- Open the system according to the instructions.




Follow these instructions to install the CPU:

- Align the processor to the carrier so that the gold triangle on the processor aligns with the triangle on the carrier, and then install the processor into the carrier.
 NOTE: Apply thermal compound evenly on the top of the CPU.
- Carefully flip the heatsink over. Align the carrier assembly so that the triangle on the carrier aligns with the triangle on the heatsink, and then install the carrier assembly onto the bottom of the heatsink.
- 3. Remove the CPU socket cover.

NOTE: Save and replace the CPU socket cover if the processor is removed from its socket.

- 4. Align the heatsink to the CPU socket using the guide pins and make sure the gold triangle is in the correct orientation. Then place the heatsink onto the top of the CPU socket.
- Secure the heatsink by tightening the screws in sequential order (1→2→3→4).
 NOTE: When removing the heatsink, loosen the screws in reverse order (4→3→2→1).






3-4 Installing the Memory

Read the following guidelines before you begin to install the memory:

- Make sure that the motherboard supports the memory. It is recommended that memory of the same capacity, brand, speed, and chips be used.
- Always turn off the system and unplug the power cord from the power outlet before installing the memory to prevent hardware damage.
- Memory modules have a foolproof design. A memory module can be installed in only one direction. If you are unable to insert the memory, switch the direction.

3-4-1 Six Channel Memory Configuration

This motherboard provides 24 DDR4 memory sockets and supports Six Channel Technology. After the memory is installed, the BIOS will automatically detect the specifications and capacity of the memory. Enabling Four Channel memory mode will be four times of the original memory bandwidth.



3-4-2 Installing a Memory




Before installing a memory module, make sure to turn off the system and unplug the power cord from the power outlet to prevent damage to the memory module.

• Be sure to install DDR4 DIMMs on this motherboard.

Follow these instructions to install the Memory:

- 1. Insert the DIMM memory module vertically into the DIMM slot, and push it down.
- 2. Close the plastic clip at both edges of the DIMM slots to lock the DIMM module.
- 3. Reverse the installation steps when you want to remove the DIMM module.



3-4-3 DIMM Population Rule







3-12-2 Motherboard Slimline 8i to PCIe Board




3-12-3 Motherboard Slimline 4i to PCIe Board






3-12-5 Motherboard to 2.5" HDD Backplane Board

3-12-6 SATA Connections between HDD Backplane Board and Daughter Board



Chapter 5 BIOS Setup

BIOS (Basic Input and Output System) records hardware parameters of the system in the EFI on the motherboard. Its major functions include conducting the Power-On Self-Test (POST) during system startup, saving system parameters and loading operating system, etc. BIOS includes a BIOS Setup program that allows the user to modify basic system configuration settings or to activate certain system features. When the power is turned off, the battery on the motherboard supplies the necessary power to the CMOS to keep the configuration values in the CMOS.

To access the BIOS Setup program, press the key during the POST when the power is turned on.



- BIOS flashing is potentially risky, if you do not encounter problems of using the current BIOS version, it is recommended that you don't flash the BIOS. To flash the BIOS, do it with caution. Inadequate BIOS flashing may result in system malfunction.
- It is recommended that you not alter the default settings (unless you need to) to prevent system
 instability or other unexpected results. Inadequately altering the settings may result in system's
 failure to boot. If this occurs, try to clear the CMOS values and reset the board to default values.
 (Refer to the Exit section in this chapter or introductions of the battery/clearing CMOS jumper in
 Chapter 4 for how to clear the CMOS values.)
